The visit of Durham for round 9 of the Championship is only the second chance for 'weekenders' to see First class cricket at the FCG, this season. You missed the first in April!

We will also welcome back to Foxes favourites of recent years when Ben Raine and Ned Eckersley return to face us. Durham started the season very slowly and for a period appeared odds on to be this years

Whipping boys. However 2 excellent wins in June has seen them climb a place above the Foxes to 8th and 3 points ahead. So should we be concerned about sitting 9th in the league with more than half the games complete? I recall the Northants fans moaning after the draw with Foxes that they had slipped to bottom but with a win during our week off they quickly climbed to 5th.
