The records for 'List A' cricket as above can be confusing as they cover many different formats excluding T20 and First class matches since the introduction of limited overs cricket in 1963. The first 'Gillette Cup' in 1963 was a 65 over a side competition, later reduced to 60 overs. In 1969 a 40 over a side competition was introduced on a Sunday afternoon. Followed in 1972 by the Benson & Hedges Cup a 55 over a side format, which ran until 2002.

The first meeting between the sides in any limited overs cricket was in 1969 with the formation of the Sunday League. A 40 overs a side format played on a Sunday afternoon in between a county championship matches. The match was delayed by rain and reduced to 37 overs a side. The Foxes were victors by 6 runs
