In the encounters down the years the 2017 game against Lancs at Liverpool stands out. Having completed a 4 day game against Sussex at Arundel the day before the Foxes were expected to travel the 260 miles to Liverpool to take on the Lightning. Leics were set a challenging 174 to win. When Matt Pillans was run out of the 5th ball of the last over 2 were required. Upstep Ackers, making his T20 debut in the UK he smashed the last ball for 6. Foxes won by 3 wickets !!

The other stand out encounter was of course the semi-final of the 2011 competition at Edgbaston. Batting first Foxes innings had been reduced to 18 overs because of rain interruptions and when Lancs innings lost 7 overs the initial target of 134 was reduced to 80 off 11. Lancs finished on 79 and with scores tied a 'Super Over' ensued. The Steven's Moore & Croft took 13 off the Claude Henderson over but Lancs couldn't contain Will Jefferson who hit 15 off 4 balls faced to see Foxes into the final with a ball to spare...and we all know what happened in that !
