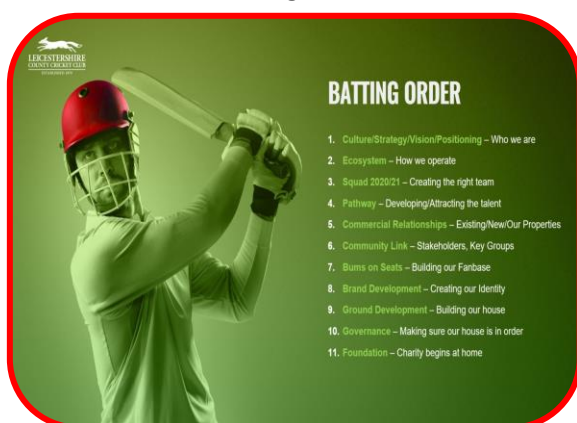


Something a little Different
